1. Physical distancing

• What will be done to implement physical distancing guidelines?

Consider: physical distancing for staff and patrons; occupancy limits based on 2sqm requirements; management of waiting areas etc.

1. All activity will follow the guidelines of allowable activities as published by the Football governing body (Football West) as well as complying with the requirements of the State Government's COVID Safety Guidelines for Sport and Recreation.
2. Team training times and pitch locations are published on the Club's website and easily complies with the 2sqm requirement for physical distancing.
3. The Club will encourage volunteers and spectators to observe physical distancing requirements of 1.5m.

2. Hygiene

• How will you ensure required hygiene standards are maintained?

Consider: hygiene protocols and practices; supply of cleaning and sanitiser products etc.

The Club will continue to remind participants, coaches, volunteers and spectators:

1. To practice good hygiene at all times.
2. That towels, water bottles or mouthguards must not be shared.
3. That spitting and clearing of nasal/ respiratory secretions in public is strongly discouraged.
5. That if they appear to be unwell they will be requested to leave the premises.

The Club will continue to provide hand sanitiser and cleaning products at each session.

3. Training and education

- How will you ensure all your workers know how to keep themselves and others safe from exposure to COVID-19?

Consider: staff training; records of training; additional education; signage; guidance material etc.

All coaches and key club personnel have undertaken the COVID19 Infection Control Training run by National Health Department. The club has a register of certification.

All coaching staff receive reminders from the Club regarding physical distancing and hygiene protocols.

4. Compliance

- I am aware that in addition to the legal obligations arising from the Emergency Management Act 2005 and the Directions made under that Act, I must continue to comply with relevant existing legislation and regulations, including WorkSafe legislation.
